



Sometimes articles are brand specific but more often than not the points discussed are relevant to all cameras or computer operating systems. If Canon has a certain function – so will Nikon/Pentax - just with a different name.

Luminous Landscape/ and Charlie Cramer/ and Focus

A website I really enjoy is the Luminous Landscape – a site started by the late Michael Reichman a noted Canadian photographer and printer.

The site is not free [USD\$12 per year] but there is plenty of value, particularly in the series of videos available and especially those videos with other noted photographers in North America. One series in particular I viewed the other day is with *Charlie Cramer* and Kevin Raber [Raber is the site operator who took over from Michael Reichman]

Four of those videos are on composition, processing and printing via Lightroom and Photoshop [but mainly composition and processing] and they really are a masterclass the best I have ever seen and very inspiring.

Cramer also uses an interesting piece of software called Focus Magic which does a good job of bringing into focus out of focus pixels – he seems to use it as a substitute for sharpening?

But, it's his use of composition that is the best part of the videos [you can also download the videos – they are quite big and are in sections so you don't have to take the whole series]

The \$15/\$16 AUD it costs to join the site is not a lot and I guarantee the videos on Cramer are worth that price alone.

There is also another [smaller] series with Raber and Jeff Schewe [who is involved in the development of Lightroom with Adobe] that also covers soft proofing and printing in Lightroom.

Schewe does all the talking and there is little he doesn't know about Lightroom [on occasions perhaps a bit too much!]

Highly recommended.
